

**CL : Is your life private online? /14****1° Changement du comportement des jeunes concernant la VIE PRIVEE /4**

- AVANT : Il y a 15 ans,

- peu d'ados britanniques pensaient qu'avoir un journal en ligne ou un blog était une bonne idée / ils ne voyaient pas l'intérêt de tout publier de leur vie privée (1)
- ils ne voyaient pas l'intérêt de parler à des gens quasi inconnus. (1)

- DE NOS JOURS, par contre,

- les ados britanniques sont beaucoup plus à l'aise avec les réseaux sociaux : 70% d'entre eux utilisent des outils tels que Snapchat, Facebook, Instagram,... Ceci dans le but de partager des commentaires ou des photos, des vidéos et autres. (1)
- Ils sont ainsi connectés à de plus en plus de gens. (1)

**=> 2° DONNER 3 EXEMPLES /3**

- a) 10 % des ados européens âgés de 9 à 16 ans ont plus de 300 amis sur Facebook.
- b) 25 % des Britanniques de 10-12 ans sont sur Facebook (alors qu'il faut avoir 13 ans pour avoir un compte normalement)
- c) 14 % affirment accepter toutes les demandes d'amis.

**3° INCONVENIENTS DES RESEAUX SOCIAUX selon les jeunes /2**

- ils admettent que recevoir des communications non désirées d'étrangers est souvent problématique (1)

- 12 % des Britanniques de 9 à 16 ans disent avoir été victimes de messages de cyber-harcèlement violents - il arrive donc maintenant que certains jeunes reçoivent des messages de haine 24h/24. (1)

**4° 2 CELEBRITES bien différentes /5****a) Les KARDASHIANS**

- Ces personnes ont décidé de vivre leurs vies aux yeux de tous/ Tous les membres de cette famille vivent, depuis 10 ans, leur vie, quasi entièrement à la TV! (1)
- Ils ne font rien pour améliorer le monde, ils sont juste intéressés par la célébrité et la mode. (1)

**b) Les DAFT PUNK**

- Contrairement aux Kardashians, les Daft Punk ( célèbre duo de musique électro) font tout pour protéger leur intimité. (1)
- Personne ne sait cependant à quoi ils ressemblent car ils ne montrent jamais leur visage en public/ Ils portent toujours des masques ou têtes de robots durant leurs concerts ou à la TV. (1)
- Leurs clips vidéos sont souvent des images animées. Ils veulent que l'on se concentre sur leur musique uniquement! (1)

4. That discovery WAS made in the 17<sup>th</sup> century.
5. We HAVE WON the tennis trophy. We WON it last year too.
6. We HAVE BEEN here for an hour and a half.
7. I HAVE only KNOWN him since my last birthday party.
8. We HAVEN'T SEEN him this week.
9. I HAVEN'T RIDDEN a bike since I WAS about fifteen or sixteen.
10. He HAS NEVER GONE there in his life. (imagine a. qu'il soit tjrs vivant,
11. HE NEVER WENT b. décédé)

3. The dog is all wet. Where **has he been** ?

4. She **has never seen** Paris. She **wanted** to go **last year** but she didn't have enough money.

5. Sorry, Peter isn't here. He **has gone** to his friend's to do his homework.

6. I **have just finished** studying my geography lesson, so now I can watch TV.

7. He **studied** history **for three years**, then he gave up. I don't now what **he's doing now**.

8. - **Did you talk** to my sister **yesterday** ?

- I **haven't seen** her **for a long time**. I don't remember when I **last saw** her.

9. **While** I **was walking** in the park with my girlfriend **last night**, a man **snatched** her handbag and **ran away**. I **couldn't run** after him because it was too dark to leave her alone. The police **haven't arrested** him **yet**.

10. - I **started** studying at university **when I was seventeen**.

- When did you get your degree ?
- I haven't got it **yet**, I'm still at university. I have only been there **for two years**.

11. That man **has been standing** at the bus stop **for twenty minutes**. Shall I/Shouldn't I tell him that the last bus **has already gone** ?

12. - She **has just sold** one of her paintings.

- She's lucky ! I **have been painting** **for three years** and I **haven't sold** a single painting **yet**.
